

How to set up an RSS Feed.

First of all, what is an RSS Feed? Well, RSS means “Really Simple Syndication” (honestly). It alerts your web browser - Firefox, Internet Explorer etc - to new items on whichever website you subscribe to. In practise, you don't have to actually go to the website in question to see if there is anything new, you simply look at the RSS link you are about to set up.

1. Go to <http://www.westcumbriaphotogroup.co.uk/news/newsfront.php> and click the orange button. This will take you to a new page.
2. This is the RSS page. There will be a yellow box at the top of the page. In the drop down menu marked “Subscribe to this feed using”, make sure you select Live Bookmarks, then click the subscribe now button.
3. A small window will open where you can give the feed a name. Make it mean something to you. I called mine “WCPG Feed”. Under that is drop down menu called “Create in”. Select Bookmarks Toolbar and click “Add”. The feed will appear in the top bar with the name you just gave it.
4. That's it. Click on it to see any new items. Clicking on a item will take you directly to the page where it is.
